FIRESIDE SIMPLE CROCHETED THROW



Wrap yourself in comfort with the Fireside Throw, a soft and cozy blanket perfect for chilly evenings and quiet mornings. Designed with first-time crocheters in mind, this simple yet beautiful pattern uses basic stitches to create a rich, textured fabric that's as relaxing to make as it is to snuggle under.

With its bold stripes and easy-to-memorize repeat, the Fireside Throw works up quickly and can be easily customized to any length. Whether you're just learning to crochet or looking for a soothing, meditative project, this throw makes the perfect companion for fireside chats, favorite shows, or a quiet moment with a book.

Create your own Fireside Throw and bring a touch of handmade warmth to your home.

PATTERN NOTES

This pattern is for a 42" x 38" throw. The size can be increased by either adding more chains to the base row, or adding more rows to the end. Larger sizes will require more yarn.

MATERIALS

Yarn - 7 Skeins Big Twist Living in Spirit (182 m, 110 g per skein)

Hook - size 4.5mm (US 7)

Other: - large darning needle

Gauge - 10 stitches x 17 rows to 4"

Skill level - beginner

ABBREVIATIONS

Ch - chain

SI - slip stitch

Tc - triple crochet

Sk - skip stitch



PATTERN

Foundation Row

Ch 142.

In the 4th ch from hook, work 2 tc (the skipped 3 chains count as the first tc).

Pattern repeat: (Sk 1 ch, sl st in next ch, sk 1 ch, 3 tc in next ch) — repeat this sequence across.

You should end with a sl st in the final ch. (You will have 34 tc clusters and 34 sl sts.)

Ch 4 and turn.

Row 2

Work 2 tc in the base of the turning ch (turning ch counts as the first tc).

Pattern repeat: (SI st in center of tc cluster from previous row, sk next tc, 3 tc in next sl st) — repeat across.

SI st in last st. Ch 4 and turn.

Repeat Row 2 until the throw reaches the desired length.



FINISHING

Use tapestry needle to sew in loose ends.
