# Crochotod Pookaboo Hat



Introducing the Peekaboo Hat, a fun and funky accessory designed to make a statement! This intermediate-level pattern showcases the playful Peekaboo Stitch, adding texture and flair to a unique design. Worked as a flat rectangle, the hat is stitched up the side and gathered at the top, creating its signature slouchy silhouette. While written as a one-size sagging hat, it can easily be adjusted for a more fitted look to suit your style. Whether you're crafting for yourself or a loved one, the Peekaboo Hat is the perfect project for adding a bold and creative touch to any wardrobe!

## Pattern Notes

The pattern is written for a **medium adult** size. To size down, decrease the number of rows worked. The piece is worked sideways, beginning with the right side edge.

#### Mat orials

**Yarn** – 1 skein Lion Brand Heartland yarn. (I used Glacier Bay) or 142g worsted weight yarn (251 yards).

Hook - size 6 mm (J)

Gauge - 12 sc x 15  $r = 4 \times 4$  "

Skill level - intermediate

## Abbroviations

Ch - chain

Sc - single crochet

Hdc - half double crochet

Hdcbl - half double crochet in back loop

Hdc2tg - half double crochet two together

Fphdc - front post half double crochet

Sk - skip



#### Pattorn

- Ch 60
- Hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc to end. Ch 2, turn.
- 20 hdcbl, (hdc2tog, ch2, sk st) repeat across row, ending with hdc2tog. Ch2, turn.
- (Hdc in sp, fphdc around hdc2tog from previous round) 13times. Hdcbl in next 20 stitches. Ch2. Turn.
- Repeat previous two rows 18 times, or until desired length. (Pictured piece is 16" x 18".)

# Finishing

- Fold item in half lengthwise.
- Seam along longer side by drawing a loop through back loop of first stitch and front loop of back stitch.
- Do the same for next two stitches (front and back). You now have 2 loops on your hook. Wrap yarn around hook and pull through both stitches, leaving one loop on hook.
- Continue this way until the entire side seam is completed.
- For the top edge, pull yarn through every two stitches, for a total of 25 loops on the hook.
- Pull yarn through all 25 stitches.
- Weave in loose ends.
